

Marching in the Light

Bishop Eiludi from Tanzania, visited chapel on the Helena residential campus to speak with the children and answer questions about what life is like there. The kids prepared questions focused on how children live in Tanzania, what they do for fun, and the role that faith plays in their homes and schooling.

The children presented Bishop Eiludi with hygiene kits they had assembled for him to take back to the students who attend Bible School in Tanzania - many of whom come from quite a distance and don't have the basics we take for granted: soap, a toothbrush, a comb, etc. This project gives the children a chance to give back and it helps them think about the needs of people outside of their immediate circle of care.



Another exciting part of chapel that day involved using the drums and shakers, donated by our wonderful supporting UCC Church in Absarokee, to prepare a song in English and Swahili called "We Are Marching in the Light of God." It was very therapeutic to sing and play as a way of sharing a point of connection between cultures. It has been gratifying to hear the kids humming the song around campus and watching the joy they have in singing and learning more about the rhythms unique to the African gospel tradition.
