

Meet Cody

Cody is an 11 year old boy who was placed at the residential campus in Helena in 2010. His family often traveled with the carnival, along with him and his little sister. Cody was raised in a physically and verbally abusive home, which included being threatened with a gun multiple times by his father.

At Intermountain in Helena, Cody learned that he can trust adults and talk about his feelings in a safe environment. After 26 months, Cody was ready to be discharged, but not ready to fully transition into a forever home. Cody was transitioned to Providence Home in Kalispell as a 'step-down' placement. He was able



to attend public school for the first time in two years and be a part of a baseball team for the first time ever! Cody continues to work on his own anger management that unfortunately was carried down to him from his father.

Cody said he is now seeing that he might have a 'normal' life one day - something he didn't think would ever be possible.

Can you provide a child a place to call home? Approximately 50 children are referred to Intermountain for placement every year. Some of these children need only days of temporary shelter care, some need a safe haven for several months or even a year, and some are in desperate need of a permanent adoptive family.
