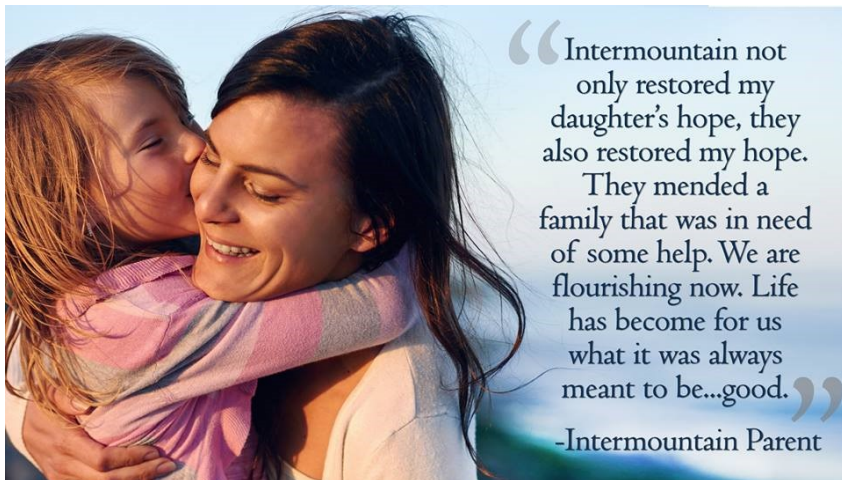


A Compassionate Approach to Care
